

"Going to" is used to tell somebody about your plans or what you intend to do:

I'm going to Australia for my holiday.
She is going to take me to hospital.
We are going to have a party tomorrow.
They are going to play tennis next Saturday.

This is how you ask someone what their plans are or what they intend to do:

Where are you going to play tennis tomorrow?
Are you going to drive to the cinema?
