"will" remains the same for each person

"will" can be shortened to "'ll" when used in conjunction with another word.

I'll be in the office tomorrow.

He'll play tennis next week.

We'll win the game.

For negations you use "won't".

"Will not" is only used when something should be emphasised.

I won't be in the office tomorrow.

He won't play tennis next week.


