

PAST SIMPLE



Past simple is used when reporting about something that happened in the past. - usually in combination with time specification, e.g. yesterday, last week etc.

regular form:

play - played listen - listened jump - jumped want - wanted

Yesterday I was at the cinema.

He did his homework last week.

Was there an accident last Monday?

irregular form:

is - was are - were do - did go - went
